Ancestris software, gratis en volledige controle over je stamboom

In dit artikel wil ik meer vertellen over de genealogische software Ancestris, het programma waarmee ik mijn stamboom sinds juni 2022 maak.

Ancestris software is toch die dure software?

Nee, dat is een wijdverbreid misverstand. Veel mensen verwarren de naam Ancestris met Ancestry, maar dat is heel wat anders. Bij Ancestry moet je inderdaad betalen om gegevens van jouw stamboom online bij Ancestry te mogen neerzetten. Maar Ancestris daarentegen is gratis, en doneren is vrijwillig. Donaties worden uitsluitend gebruikt voor het onderhoud en de kosten van de Ancestris website. Ook zonder te doneren werkt Ancestris volledig en zonder beperkingen.

Wat is Ancestris dan wel?

Ancestris bestaat al sinds 1998 (voorheen als GENJ) en wordt in 170 landen gebruikt. Het programma wordt onderhouden door een groep van vrijwilligers. Zij werkten jarenlang met andere genealogie programma's en wilden niet meer afhankelijk zijn van dure software. Daarom besloten ze zelf Ancestris te ontwikkelen.

Het programma is dus gratis, open-source software en daardoor transparant, betrouwbaar, veilig, flexibel en beter afgestemd op de behoeften van de gebruikersgemeenschap. De code is volledig openbaar en toegankelijk op hun website.

Ancestris draait uitsluitend lokaal op je eigen computer zonder verbinding met externe servers. Behalve voor het downloaden van het programma zelf, is er geen internetverbinding nodig. Jouw stamboom blijft volledig onder jouw controle, niemand anders heeft toegang. Je kunt je stamboom met anderen delen, zonder hen te dwingen dure software aan te schaffen.

Voor wie is Ancestris bedoeld?

Ancestris kan door iedereen worden gebruikt, zowel beginners als experts. Het draait op Windows, Linux en macOS. Gebruikers die van platform wisselen, kunnen dus zonder conversie of softwarewijziging blijven werken aan hun stamboom. Het uitvoerbestand is altijd in GEDCOM formaat, en kan eenvoudig worden uitgewisseld met andere genealogieprogramma's en online diensten die een correcte GEDCOM ondersteunen.

De software is afhankelijk van Java, en werkt daarom niet op mobiele telefoons of tablets. Het aangemaakte GEDCOM bestand kan echter nog steeds op dergelijke apparaten worden gebruikt met compatibele programma's.

Interestingly, Elizabeth I granted Poole a Charter in 1574, whereby it became a county town which was, at that time, separate from the county of Dorset.


